INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

This intergovernmental agreement entered into effective the first day of January, 2025 by and between Crittenden County, Arkansas (Crittenden County), Marion, Arkansas (Marion) and West Memphis, Arkansas (West Memphis).

Whereas, Crittenden County has provided dispatch services through its communication center to calls for law enforcement assistance, fire protection assistance, ambulance services and other calls for assistance, hereinafter referred to as emergency services, from within the unincorporated areas of Crittenden County and the incorporated cities and towns in Crittenden County except West Memphis in past years; and

Whereas, the State of Arkansas 911 Board has mandated dispatch services through a central communications center for unincorporated Crittenden County and the cities and towns in Crittenden County, be consolidated on or before January 1, 2025 if 911 funds are to continue to be forwarded to agencies furnishing dispatch services; and

Whereas, representatives of Crittenden County, Marion, and West Memphis have conducted planning sessions for consolidation of emergency services into one facility owned by Crittenden County, which has resulted in development of a Crittenden County Emergency Communication Consolidation Plan (Plan) that is attached as Exhibit A so as to continue to be eligible to receive all 911 funds available; and

Whereas the parties hereto desire to enter into an intergovernmental agreement to implement this plan.

Now therefore the undersigned parties agree as follows:

1. Beginning effective January 1, 2025, all communication necessary to dispatch calls for law enforcement assistance, fire protection assistance, ambulance services, and other

calls for assistance hereinafter referred to as emergency services, from within the unincorporated areas of Crittenden County and the incorporated cities and towns in Crittenden County, shall be performed and housed at Crittenden County Communication Center owned by Crittenden County at 354 Afco Road in West Memphis, Arkansas.

2. The cost of equipping and renovation of this communication center facility which is projected to be \$234,088.00, less any contribution from the State of Arkansas, shall be borne by Crittenden County except West Memphis shall contribute certain equipment it presently owns to Crittenden County Communication Center.

3. Thereafter the cost of operation of consolidated Crittenden County Communication Center, which includes but is not limited to salaries, maintenance of building, supplies, and additional equipment, over revenues received by Crittenden County, from PCAP revenues, maintenance revenues, landline revenues, 911 rural enhancement shall be divided by the parties hereto in direct proportion to the usage of the Crittenden County Communication Center as documented by monthly reports of emergency services calls originating from the unincorporated areas of Crittenden County and all towns therein except Marion and West Memphis (Crittenden County), city limits of West Memphis (West Memphis), and city limits of, Arkansas (Marion) beginning on January 1, 2025. Crittenden County shall furnish such reports to Marion and West Memphis on a monthly basis and shall bill Marion and West Memphis on or before February 1, 2026 and on the same date yearly thereafter. Communication Center Director shall allow representatives of West Memphis or Marion to inspect the Communication Center operation and records of call origins reasonable to satisfy West Memphis or Marion they are not being required to contribute over their proportionate share.

4. Details of Staffing and Operation of Communication Center

A. Staffing

Crittenden County Communication Center operations shall be directed by Communication Center Director initially selected by majority vote of Crittenden County Communication Center Board. This Board shall consist of Crittenden County Judge, Crittenden County Sheriff, Crittenden County Treasurer, Crittenden County Director of Emergency Services, West Memphis Mayor, West Memphis Police Chief, West Memphis Fire Chief, West Memphis Director of Emergency Services, Marion Mayor, Marion Police Chief, Marion Fire Chief and Marion City Attorney. The Communication Center Director shall be an employee of Crittenden County subject to the supervision of the Crittenden County Communication Center Board. Any subsequent Communication Center Director shall be selected by the County Judge of Crittenden County.

Initial dispatchers who are projected to be twenty-six (26) full-time and four (4) part-time dispatchers shall be selected by majority vote of Crittenden County Communication Center Board. Dispatchers will be employees of Crittenden County and will be supervised by Crittenden County Communication Center Director. Any subsequent employees shall be selected by Communication Center Director with consent of Crittenden County Judge.

B. Salary and benefits of Communication Center Director and dispatchers shall be set by budgeting process of Crittenden County Quorum Court. Crittenden County Communication Center Board shall make recommendation of starting salaries for director and dispatchers to the Crittenden County Quorum Court. Beginning salaries of dispatchers that will be recommended to Crittenden County Quorum Court shall be in accordance with salaries West Memphis dispatchers currently are earning at the time of the execution of this agreement.

C. Equipment

Crittenden County and West Memphis will contribute any communication equipment they own to equip consolidated Communication Center that is suitable for use as may be determined by the Communication Center Director and Crittenden County Office of Emergency Management Director. Thereafter obtaining of additional equipment and replacement of initial equipment necessary for proper operation of Communication Center shall be responsibility of Communication Center Director and Crittenden County Office of Emergency Management Director. Any equipment housed in and used in the Communication Center shall become the property of Crittenden County with the exception of equipment originally furnished by West Memphis, which shall be property of West Memphis. In 2025 and subsequent years the costs of additional and replacement equipment shall be divided among the parties in proportion to their respective usage as documented as set forth in paragraph No. 3.

5. Obligation and Collection

West Memphis and Marion agree to pay respective sums they owe annually to Crittenden County within thirty (30) days after billing. In the event such sums are not paid within this period, a late fee of 5% of amount owing shall be assessed for every month overdue. If annual amounts due are not paid within ninety (90) days with late fees, then Crittenden County shall have a cause of action against any defaulting city for debt and late fee and interest at the rate of 6% per annum and/or the right to cancel this agreement with such defaulting city upon thirty (30) days' notice in writing as well as any other remedy existing in law. The prevailing party in such litigation shall be entitled to receive reasonable attorneys' fees.

6. This Agreement and disputes arising herein shall be controlled by the law of Arkansas and venue shall lie in the Crittenden County Circuit Court.

7. This agreement shall remain in force and effect unless cancelled by any party hereto by giving written notice of cancellation subsequent to 2025 at least sixty (60) days in advance of cancellation for the successive year by mail to the County Judge of Crittenden County at 100 Court Street, Marion, Arkansas. In the event one party cancels and the other parties desire for consolidated communication center to continue amongst such parties, it will be necessary for such parties to reach an agreement among themselves in so far as this intergovernmental agreement envisions three (3) participants.

8. This is the entire agreement among the parties and any amendment thereto must be in writing and signed by the parties hereto.

Governance and Funding

Currently, there are two PSAPs operating in Crittenden County. One is based out of the City of West Memphis and the other is out of Crittenden County Sheriff's Department. The new Crittenden County Multi-Jurisdictional Communications Center will be governed by a 9-1-1 board that will be made up of representatives throughout Crittenden County. Examples of board members will be fire chiefs, police chiefs, mayors, sheriff, emergency management and other leaders with a vested interest throughout Crittenden County.

The funding for the PSAP will be made up of the current revenues that are received by Crittenden County, West Memphis and contributions from municipalities for shortfall. We are estimating that these will break down as follows:

PSAP Revenues = \$760,000.00
 PSAP Maintenance = \$80,000.00
 Landline Revenues = \$80,000.00
 9-1-1 Rural Enhancement = \$12,000.00
 Totals = \$932,000.00 (Before Shortfall Payments)

This leaves the department an estimated \$400,000.00 short of its estimated yearly expenses of \$1,340,440.00. The \$400,000.00 shortfall will be split three ways based on usage by call volume of the Communications Center. Crittenden County, City of West Memphis, and the City of Marion will pay on a pro rata share basis for their use of the Communications Center. A total shortfall will be figured each year and each entity will be sent a bill for their portion of the shortfall. The percentage of the shortfall will be calculated using the municipalities number of 9-1-1 calls that the center receives from each entity during a said year in comparison to the total number of 9-1-1 calls the center receives for the given year.

Example:

If 50% of the call received by the Communications Center are for the City of West Memphis and the annual budget shortfall is \$400,000.00, the City of West Memphis would be responsible for \$200,000 to supplement the center. Crittenden County will be billed their respective percentage and the City of Marion theirs to supplement the Center.

Operations will be created thru the merging of two separate entities that are coming together for the first time.

The entire basis for operations will be focused on utilizing

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new equipment, new staffing requirements, focus on the entire service of Crittenden County's Emergency Services Network as it has never been approached.

The key to operations will be the successful introduction of the new personnel from West Memphis Operations in to the Crittenden County Communications Center.

The concept of the entire center being merged has always been discussed, at present there are many obstacles that are yet to be identified that prevent an operational flow chart from being created.

People are the key, the development of supervisory staffing per shift, monitoring call takers/radio dispatch efficiency, TRAINING, TRAINING, TRAINING.

FACILITY NARRATIVE

An upgrade to facility is necessary to accommodate this consolidation. It will include relocation/replacement of exiting consoles, installation/upgrades to existing monitors, speakers. This includes electrical upgrade to allow additional equipment installation.

Equipment/Radio room will require upgrades and restructuring to allow for new AWIN systems to be placed in this Center.

The existing backup electrical source is a 90kw generator. A system upgrade will include the installation of a "Quick Connect" switch to ensure the immediate access to additional electrical if needed in an emergency by an add-on generator if current source were to become disabled.

Now therefore be it resolved by the Quorum Court of Crittenden County, Arkansas that County Judge of Crittenden County be and he is hereby authorized to enter into mutual aid agreement (interlocal agreement) with Marion and West Memphis to provide for location of public safety answering point to current site of Crittenden County Dispatch Center to be operated by Crittenden County employees to serve West Memphis, Marion, and other towns and cities in Crittenden County, Arkansas together with the unincorporated areas of the county with the cost of operation thereon to be shared between Crittenden County, Arkansas, West Memphis, Arkansas, and Marion, Arkansas as they may agree among themselves in mutual aid agreement (interlocal agreement) in accordance with Arkansas Code Annotated § 12-10-304(2)(3).
